

## **A Bill to promote alternative energy**

**Whereas,** the United States ranks as one of the top fossil fuel consumers in the world and is severely dependent on foreign oil.

**Whereas,** new technologies have been created to diminish the consumption of fossil fuels including wind farms, algae technology, and biofuel.

**Section 1:** Funds for green energy will be reallocated by lowering the budget for U.S. oil subsidies which could give between 10 and 25 billion dollars yearly.

**Section 2:** The Department of Energy will be responsible for distributing funds to private companies striving for effective alternative energy technologies to replace current energy sources.

**Section 3:** Private companies receiving government grants are required to cut energy consumption by 20% by 2014 to continue to receive grants.

**Section 4:** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**Therefore**, be it resolved by this student Congress here assembled that marijuana should be legalized by the U.S. Federal Government

## **A Bill Promoting Privacy Restrictions for Social Networking Websites**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS

**SECTION 1.** The USFG will increase social networking site privacy standards in order to protect its users.

- A. Increasing profile restrictions on personal information
- B. Implementing a minimum age requirement for users of social networking sites
- C. Ensuring users recognize these restrictions by having websites clearly communicating these privacy standards

**SECTION 3.** The National Security Agency/Central Security Service (NSA/CSS) shall implement and enforce this bill.

**SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Be it resolved in this Student Congress assembled that all healthy homosexuals be granted the right to donate blood, in order to increase blood donations.

## **A Resolution Concerning the Execution of the Mentally Ill**

**Whereas** several mentally ill individuals have been executed in the United States for crimes they were not culpable for and

**Whereas** mentally sane individuals can receive reduced sentences by pleading temporary insanity and

**Whereas** the United States Judicial System is based off a system of corrections rather than a system of punishments;

Be it resolved in this Student Congress here assembled that all individuals who have committed crimes and have a history of mental illness shall be exempt from the death penalty and any non-compliant states will face fines of 100,000 dollars.
