

Round 1

A Bill to Dismantle the Federal Department of Education
BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED
THAT:

SECTION 1. The Department of Education shall be abolished.

SECTION 2. As part of the department's closure, the Secretary of Education shall direct staff to work with individual states' departments of education to take full responsibility for functions previously reserved for the national bureaucracy.

SECTION 4. Closure of this department shall be complete by December 31, 2014.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Round 2

A Resolution to Establish a Flat Income Tax

Whereas: The U. S. and many states have huge and growing debt levels, and

Whereas: The populace is concerned that the wealthy have too many tax advantages and therefore pay less taxes than the middle and lower classes, and

Whereas: Debate over tax legislation consumes a disproportionate share of legislators' time and attention, and

Whereas: Currently, not all states collect state income tax and rates are widely varied among those states that do collect income taxes, and

Whereas: Many taxpayers maintain residency based on state income tax rates.

Be It Resolved By the Congress Here Assembled: All existing United States Federal Government and state government tax codes shall be abolished and the U. S. Federal Government and all state governments shall establish a flat income tax system.

Round 3

A Bill to End the Tobacco Subsidy

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED
THAT:**

Section 1. The United States Federal Government shall end all subsidies given to farmers for growing tobacco.

Section 2. A subsidy is defined as a sum of money granted by the government to assist an industry in order to influence the price of a commodity.

Section 3. This bill will be overseen by the Department of Agriculture.

Section 4. This legislation will take effect one year after passage.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void
